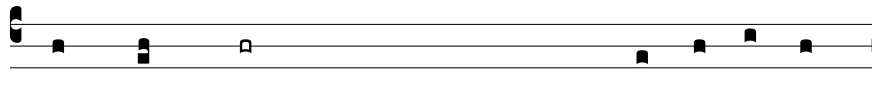
1. Blessed is the one whose fault is taken away, whose



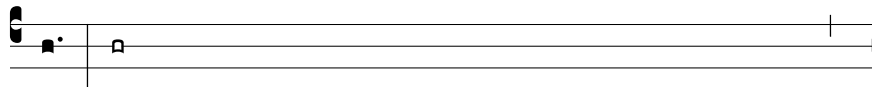
sin is covered. Blessed the man to whom the LORD



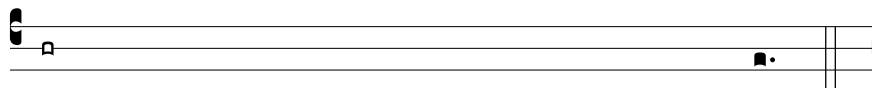
imputes not guilt, in whose spirit there is *no* guile. R̄.



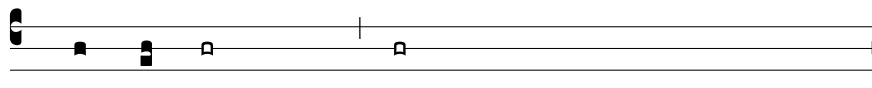
2. I acknowledged my sin to you, my *guilt* I covered
