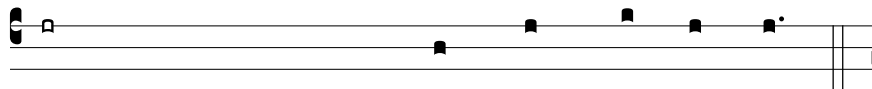
1. When I behold your heavens, the work of your fingers,



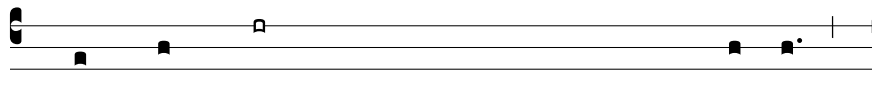
the moon and the stars which you *set* in place —



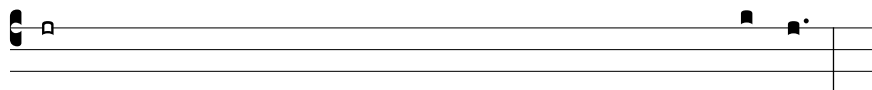
what is man that you should be mindful of him,



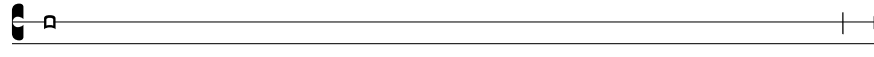
or the son of man that *you* should care for him? R̄.



2. You have made him little less than the *an*-gels,



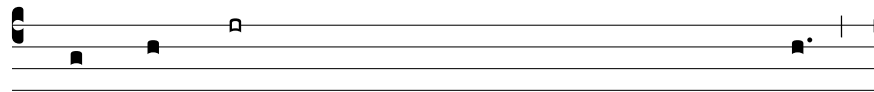
and crowned him with glory and *hon*-or.



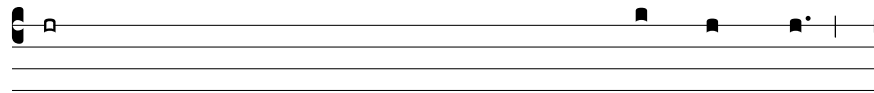
You have given him rule over the works of your hands,



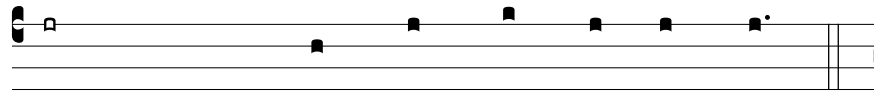
putting all things *un-der* his feet: Ṙ.
